Federally Subsidized abortion in Obamacare

When President Obama was explaining Obamacare to the American public, pro-lifers were concerned that plans for huge federal subsidies would subsidize abortion-covering plans with taxpayer money.

President Obama replied that "No federal dollars will be used to fund abortions." Abortion-covering plans would require a separate payment from the client to pay for the abortion coverage itself.

That was then. This is now.

The Government Accountability Office (GAO) has produced a report indicating that the concerns of pro-lifers were valid.

Of those who signed up for plans on the government website, 87% used at least some kind of subsidy. No check was reported to have been made on whether the plans they selected covered abortion.

Furthermore, according to National Right to Life News, "not a single one of the 18 insurance companies that

are selling abortion-covering plans, and that responded to the GAO, actually were collecting a separate payment from enrollees for elective abortion coverage."

In addition, the legislative language required states to make sure there were plans available to pro-lifers that did not cover elective abortion. That is not currently enforced either. According to the GAO, in five states - Connecticut, Hawaii, New Jersey, Rhode Island, and Vermont - "every insurance plan currently sold on the exchange covers elective abortion."

In other states — California, New York, Massachusetts, and Oregon — abortion coverage was the general rule, appearing in 92 – 98% of the plans.

The House of Representatives has passed a "No Taxpayer Funding for Abortion" Act that would help resolve the issue. Senator Harry Reid has prevented action on a similar Senate bill.

Remember Savita?

Fast news tends to mean emotional reporting that can produce hysterical reactions and counterproductive efforts at corrective actions.

Such was the case with Savita Halappanavar, who died in an Irish hospital of infection. She thought she was miscarrying and asked for an abortion, which Irish law does not permit. She died of infection after a week in the hospital.

The media went wild and claimed that her death was due to the lack of an abortion. As a result, the Irish law was changed, ostensibly to save further victims like Savita.

However, a recent report by Ireland's Health Information and Quality Authority "shows that Savita's death had nothing to do with the abortion law. It was caused by incompetence."

There were basic errors made in her care that failed to note the changes in her condition that warranted different procedures. As a review of her records shows, there were "a number of missed opportunities" which might have changed the outcome of the case. Nine of the people involved in her medical care have been disciplined.

BioEdge reports little effort by the media to correct the false impression they trumpeted to help get the abortion law changed. It reports a statement by Cora Sherlock, a solicitor and deputy chairman of Prolife Campaign. She said, "Those who pushed the distorted version of the story hardest from the start have never bothered to set the record straight in light of all the reports that have contradicted their initial presentation of the case." She added, "These journalists and politicians were happy to hard wire a false account of what happened into people's minds and to this day they have no intention of disturbing their original narrative."

More data from India linking abortion and breast cancer

Twelve recent studies coming out of India all indicate an increase in breast cancer among women who had prior abortions.

India is a good country for gathering data on the link because the risk factors found in the Western world are generally not present in India. In India, women marry relatively young, they have a lot of children, they breastfeed, and they do not use birth control pills. Therefore the increased risk attributable to the other factors is not present and the increase is more likely to be due to the abortions.

The risk shown in these studies is quite variable, but consistently large. On the average, they indicate that Indian women with prior abortions have five and a half times the probability of developing breast cancer as those who did not have abortions.

It's one more piece of information that says women who have had abortions should be careful to have their exams on a regular basis.

It is reasonable for us as pro-lifers to suggest such precautions to women who might not have access to the risk information that is becoming increasingly clearer. We must always remember in such discussions that not everyone who has breast cancer has had an abortion, and not everyone who has an abortion develops breast cancer. We are talking about risk, not certainty.

When my wife became pregnant with our 5th child when she was 40 years old, the inevitable question came from our OBGYN: Should we do an amniocentesis to make sure the baby is OK? Our response was why? We would accept whatever child God gives us even though there was history in our family.

I had two cousins and an aunt who were born with Downs syndrome. Each was loved and treated as a full member of their families. They were each, in their own ways, beautiful and loving people, who lived full lives, and in two cases lived on their own.

The real question is, to whom are we being "kinder"? Isn't this question of selective abortion just another way of insuring our own comfort because we believe we will suffer somehow from the presence of a Downs child? For whose benefit are we really aborting such a child? It is an act of selfishness, just as sex-selection abortion is an act of arrogant selfishness, perpetrated on the unborn in a quest for perfection and convenience.

Surrogacy goes south

Potential customers in search of women to be surrogate mothers for their children are experiencing difficulties as India and Thailand, both favored locations, are now reducing opportunities for foreigners. International disputes have arisen in recent years with surrogate mothers refusing to abort possibly handicapped babies, and the biological parents refusing to pay for or accept disabled babies.

The poverty-ridden state of Tabasco in Mexico is now seeing an increase in surrogacy traffic. Surrogacy is legal in Tabasco, but only if done "altruistically." Therefore, contracts between the two parties do not state that the surrogate mother is to receive more than coverage for her expenses, sometimes calling it "economic assistance." The lack of documentation of terms leaves the door open to the abuses additional to those already documented in the surrogacy field.



Stem cells and macular degeneration

Induced pluripotent stem cells (iPSC) were made from skin cells of a patient's arm and, after transformation into specialized eye cells, used to treat age-related macular degeneration (AMD). The cells were grafted into her eye. The patient is one of six recruited for the study in Japan.

It is a pilot study, intended to explore the safety of the technique developed by Masayo Takahashi. Researchers are interested to see how well these grafted cells integrate with the existing cells in the eye.

There are no human embryos killed in the process of creating iPSC cells.

Memorial to Nazi's euthanasia victims

The Nazis didn't start out killing Jews. Their early targets included the mentally and physically handicapped. The Nazis killed them, using methods they would later perfect and employ in the death camps.

A memorial was opened in Berlin in September, to recognize the 300,000 victims who died in what the Nazis called their "euthanasia" program. The memorial is a "striking piece of modern architecture: a 30-metre-long wall of blue glass in the open air near the Berlin Philharmonic."

Germany's state minister for culture and media said, "We must denounce the inhumane distinction between a worthy and an unworthy life. Every human life is valuable - that's the message of this memorial."

Not worth treating?

Michael Cook, the editor of BioEdge, summarized the case of a Belgian rapist and murderer, Frank Van Den Bleeken. Van Den Bleeken said that he could not control himself and considered himself too dangerous to ever be released. He therefore requested euthanasia because the thought of life in prison caused him considerable suffering. Cook illuminates what you might call "the back story."

"Strictly speaking, despite his horrific crime, Van Den Bleeken was not a prisoner but a patient. He was being held "at the Governor's pleasure" ... because he was mentally ill and a danger to society. Belgium's dysfunctional mental health system was unable to treat him, so Van Den Bleeken applied to be transferred to a Dutch prison with advanced treatment for sex offenders. When the Belgian government refused, Van Den Bleeken requested euthanasia.

"In short, Van Den Bleeken's suffering could have been cured, but it was either too expensive or too much bother for the Belgian government. As with most cases of euthanasia or assisted suicide, the real problem is that society has tossed its most vulnerable citizens onto a scrap heap."

Van Den Bleeken requested permission three years ago, but there is disagreement. The sisters of his victim oppose the euthanasia. Even Belgium's euthanasia expert is uneasy about the issue.

Mental activity in "vegetative" patients

A new study by neuroscientists Lorina Naci and Adrian Owen shows brain activity associated with moments of high suspense in normal people can be also found in some patients diagnosed as "vegetative."

An 8-minute excerpt from an Alfred Hitchcock episode produced "attention" brain activity in normal volunteers, as measured by a relatively new technique called functional magnetic resonance imaging (fMRI). During the film, the fMRI recorded higher brain activity in the regions that control attention and also documented that the activity built in intensity until the climax of the film. Researchers noted that the same excerpt produced similar recordings in a 35-year old man who had been deemed unresponsive since the age of 17.

Researchers said it meant that he was not only aware of the video but could also follow the plot. A second patient did not demonstrate the same responsive brain activity.

Researchers were hopeful that their technique could help to determine who is actually responsive, contrary to appearance.

State laws are of primary importance

So why don't we just pass a Constitutional amendment defining unborn children as persons? Wouldn't that protect them everywhere?

Not quite. The Constitution is put into action by laws, state and some federal. For instance, not all killings are treated alike. State laws differentiate between a hit-man who takes money to kill someone's rival, a wife who in a moment of anger pushes her husband down the stairs, and an inebriated driver who accidentally hits and kills a pedestrian.

State laws would have to be written to uphold the Constitution's newly established protection of unborn persons, because none of the existing laws would really apply. Some states might choose to call abortion murder; these states would probably already have laws discouraging abortion. Other states, perhaps like New York, might treat it as no more serious than a traffic infraction.

The primary importance for protection of unborn babies still lies at the level of the state. We need pro-life legislators to help change the culture of death in our state. We need to change the attitudes by enacting laws requiring parental notification / permission for abortion in the case of minors, laws requiring waiting periods and informed consent, and laws prohibiting the bullying of pro-life pregnancy centers by unfriendly groups or local governments. When laws change, attitudes change gradually over time. We need to be (and are!) working now to change the laws.
